Sheriff Regalado,

This data analysis extends from January 1<sup>st</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup> of 2019. There were a total of 22 investigated events. In comparison to 2018 there were 48 reports. Also in 2019, there were 6 substantiated allegations (up 1), 5 unsubstantiated allegations (down 13), and 11 unfounded allegations (down 13).

There appear to be no significant problem areas. Adaptations to the PREA system are ongoing. The inmate's names were redacted to protect the safety and security of the inmates, other inmates, and the security of the facility as a whole.

Corrective action was taken on an ongoing basis. The review teams and quarterly operations meetings provided valuable information on process system changes, training, and improvement of overall systems. The PREA system is progressing. In 2019 we continued to provide additional training to contractors and supervisory employees. In 2020 we will strive to improve reporting and will implement PowerDMS to assist with management of standards and audits.

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) was passed in 2003 with unanimous support from both parties in Congress. The purpose of the Act was to “provide for the analysis of the incidence and effects of prison rape in Federal, State and Local institutions and to provide information, resources, recommendations and funding to protect individuals from prison rape.” This law applies to all public and private institutions that house adult or juvenile offenders.

The Tulsa County Sheriff’s Office is committed to a zero-tolerance standard towards all forms of sexual abuse and sexual harassment between employees, volunteers or contractors and offenders as well as offender upon offender sexual abuse or harassment.

How to report incidents of sexual assault or sexual abuse:

TCSO accepts and investigates reports regarding allegations or knowledge of sexual abuse of offenders from third parties including family, friends, clergy, vendors, contractors, or any other person having knowledge of an incident.
