Sheriff Regalado,

This data analysis extends from January 1st through December 31st of 2023. There was a total of 15 investigated events. In comparison to 2022 there were 12 reports. Also in 2023, there was 1 substantiated allegation, 2 unsubstantiated allegations, and 12 unfounded allegations. This increase generally indicates that inmates are more comfortable approaching officers to report an event, unlike previous years.

Adaptations to the PREA system are ongoing. The quarterly operational reviews are proving to be productive in continual review of processes put into place for PREA standards. During 2023, the goal was to train additional personnel in the compliance and coordination duties set forth in the PREA standards. For 2024, the goal is to continue training additional personnel to ensure consistency within the agency.

In 2023, we continued preparing for the next PREA audits to be scheduled in 2024, for both DOJ and DHS.

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) was passed in 2003 with unanimous support from both parties in Congress. The purpose of the Act was to "provide for the analysis of the incidence and effects of prison rape in Federal, State and Local institutions and to provide information, resources, recommendations and funding to protect individuals from prison rape." This law applies to all public and private institutions that house adult or juvenile offenders.

The Tulsa County Sheriff's Office is committed to a zero-tolerance standard towards all forms of sexual abuse and sexual harassment between employees, volunteers or contractors and offenders as well as offender upon offender sexual abuse or harassment.

How to report incidents of sexual assault or sexual abuse:

TCSO accepts and investigates reports regarding allegations or knowledge of sexual abuse of offenders from third parties including family, friends, clergy, vendors, contractors, or any other person having knowledge of an incident.
